

PRESS RELEASE: APRIL 3, 2008

On March 20, 2008 staff from the Division of Water Supply with the State of Tennessee, Department of Environment and Conservation, conducted a Sanitary Survey of the Castalian Springs-Bethpage Utility District. A Sanitary Survey is comprised of an on-site inspection and file review to evaluate the operational performance of the water system. The District has earned a score of one-hundred (100). This places the water system in the "Approved" category of public water systems in Tennessee.

"The water system has made vast improvements in its operation and in record keeping over the past few Sanitary Surveys. The Division would like to commend the water system in the improvements it has made, especially in the areas of record keeping, line repairs, implementing an active flushing program, and in implementing and maintaining a working Cross Connection Program," stated Erich Webber, Acting Manager of the Division of Water Supply.

"We are overjoyed. All the hard work from the staff is really paying off. When the State inspects and finds no major concerns it is time to celebrate. The customers of this Utility should be celebrating also," stated District Manager Bennie Oldham.
